**HISTORICAL NOTEBOOK**  
by Frank Passic ~ Albion Historian



**ALBION HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL 1956 HOMECOMING PARADE**

October is football month for our area high schools. Albion High School was part of the Twin Valley league during the 1950s, and one of the toughest teams they had to play against was the East Lansing Trojans. The 1956 season saw Albion play the Trojans for Albion's homecoming. Albion didn't have its own football field back then, and so until 1967 they played at Briton Field at Albion College.

A favorite event for homecoming was a homecoming parade, with floats from the various classes and others groups. These parades were held in downtown Albion the afternoon of the game. From our Historical Notebook this week we present a photo of the 1956 homecoming parade in downtown Albion. Featured are the football players around a float bearing the legend "Push Those Trojans Back to Troy." A shield with a cross is part of the design and appears on the right. In the distance, left to right are

these businesses: Miller Jewelers, Union Store, Albion Paint Spot, and of course, the Bohm Theatre. Unfortunately, Albion lost their homecoming game that year, by a score of 19 Albion, 20 East Lansing, but won all their others. The 1957 Breeze Annual summarized that season: "The 1956-57 football season was another successful one as the final Twin Valley standings found Albion in second place, the only loss being to East Lansing, the title holder, and the team rated first in State Class B standings. In that same poll Albion was rated fifth for the second year in a row. The Wildcats piled up a record of seven wins and one loss in conference play, and one win in a "non-league" game against Grand Ledge before the start of the regular season." How many of our readers ever attended an Albion High School homecoming parade?

**MDHHS issues interpretive statement on vaping emergency rules**

LANSING, Mich. – The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) recently released an interpretive statement regarding the Emergency Rules for Protection of Youth from Nicotine Addiction.  
The statement clarifies that the emergency rules prohibit selling, giving or otherwise distributing flavored nicotine vapor products in the state of Michigan. The rules do not, however, prohibit mere possession of flavored nicotine vapor products in Michigan.

Nor do they prohibit returns of such products to a wholesaler or manufacturer, or transportation of such products to persons outside the State of Michigan.  
"Implementing these rules is a huge step in protecting our kids from the dangerous effects of vaping," said Dr. Jo-neigh Khaldun, chief medical executive and chief deputy for health for MDHHS. "Right now, too many youth in Michigan have gotten hooked on nicotine because vaping companies are marketing fla-

vors like candy, apple juice and cappuccino. Prohibiting the sale of these flavored nicotine vaping products will help us protect our kids and our overall public health."  
In September, Michigan became the first state in the nation to announce a ban on flavored nicotine vaping products. Since then, the White House and Governors Cuomo (New York) and Newsom (California) have announced similar actions to protect kids from nicotine addiction.



Questions & Answers About Our Environment

Dear EarthTalk: Is the plan to sprinkle dust in the stratosphere to reflect some of the sun's rays away from Earth to prevent global warming science or science fiction?

—M. Jackson, Tampa, FL

Some certainly do consider

it science fiction, or worry that it could end up doing more environmental harm than good. Yet others—including Bill Gates and a team of leading Harvard scientists—think it could be the solution to our planetary climate woes.

What we're talking about is a form of geo-engineering that entails sending up some 800 jumbo planes to sprinkle their payload of millions of tons of chalk dust in the stratosphere 12 miles above the Earth's surface in an effort to reflect some of the sun's heat back into space to turn the tide on climate change.

The so-called Stratospheric Controlled Perturbation Experiment (SCoPEX) was developed by chemist James

Anderson and physicist David Keith, both of Harvard—with funding from Bill Gates—"to advance understanding of stratospheric aerosols that could be relevant to solar geo-engineering." The researchers want to test their hypothesis with a \$3 million experiment 12 miles above the Southwest United States where they would steer remote controlled balloons to disperse small plumes of calcium carbonate.

The balloons would then turn around and observe any differences in the amount of solar radiation getting through. This system is adapted from a similar design the researchers used in groundbreaking research analyzing the composition of the strato-

spheric ozone layer.

But the test plan, initially slated for early 2019, has received some pushback from scientists and environmentalists, who worry that such tinkering could cause negative chain reactions and unforeseen irreversible consequences.

"Some researchers have suggested that solar geoengineering could alter precipitation patterns and even lead to more droughts in some regions," reports Jeff Tolleson on Nature.com. "Others warn that one of the possible benefits of solar geoengineering—maintaining crop yields by protecting them from heat stress—might not come to pass." He cites a 2018 study

showing that yields of wheat, corn, rice and soy fell after two major volcanic eruptions darkened skies around the planet and took a toll on crop yields.

Given such concerns, Anderson and Keith are erring on the side of caution, setting up an external advisory committee to review the project and point out potential safety concerns to head off negative side effects. "Getting it done right is far more important than getting it done quickly," says Peter Frumhoff of the Union of Concerned Scientists.

If they can pull off a successful test and then scale the idea, the good news is it might even be something the governments of the world—and/

or some rich benefactors—can afford. An October 2018 report from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change found that dispersing enough sulfur in the stratosphere with a similar (cooling) intent could be done for less than \$10 billion/year—and possibly for as little as \$1 billion/year. While that might seem like a lot, it's a bargain if it can save our environment, our civilization, and our very existence on the planet.

## Donate blood with the Red Cross to help those fighting cancer

LANSING, Mich. (Oct. 7, 2019) — During Breast Cancer Awareness Month this October, the American Red Cross urges eligible donors to give blood or platelets to provide hope and healing to patients fighting cancer.

In August 2016, Myel Bowers-Smith went to the doctor for what she thought was a breast infection for a mosquito bite. Instead, she received the devastating diagnosis — she had stage 4 inflammatory breast cancer, a very rare and aggressive breast carcinoma. Bowers-Smith, a U.S. Army veteran, committed to fighting for her life. "Once I began fighting, I knew I had to remain strong," she said. Her care plan included five different chemotherapy treatments and steroids.

Like many patients with cancer, Bowers-Smith needed multiple blood product transfusions. Cancer patients under-

going surgery and chemotherapy may require red blood cell or platelet transfusions. In fact, more than half of all platelets collected by the Red Cross are used by patients with cancer.

After months of grueling treatments, in August 2017, Bowers-Smith celebrated the news that her cancer was in remission. Today, she enjoys sharing her story and encouraging others to be a blessing by donating blood or platelets. "Eligible donors, you have something good — which is your blood. A pint of blood can help save lives."

Donors of all blood types, especially platelet donors and those with type O blood, are needed to ensure a stable supply for cancer patients and others this fall. Appointments can be made by downloading the free Red Cross Blood Donor App, visiting [RedCrossBlood.org](http://RedCrossBlood.org), calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or enabling

the Blood Donor Skill on any Alexa Echo device.

Those who come to give blood or platelets during the month of October will automatically be entered for a chance to win one of five \$500 gift cards.

A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.





- 1 red bell pepper, thinly sliced
- 4 green onion, sliced
- 3 carrots, shredded and grated
- 1/2 cucumber, sliced into matchsticks
- 1 bunch fresh basil
- 1 bunch fresh mint
- 1/4 cup crushed peanuts
- sliced limes, for garnish

To make Peanut Sauce: In small saucepan over low heat, combine peanut butter, soy sauce, rice vinegar, brown sugar, garlic sauce, lime juice, garlic, ginger, fish sauce, milk and water. Add more water for thinner sauce, if desired.

To make Lettuce Wraps: Fill lettuce leaves with chicken and Peanut Sauce; top with bell pepper, onion, carrots, cucumber, basil and mint. Sprinkle crushed peanuts on top and garnish with lime slices.

Peanut Butter Breakfast Bread Pudding with Maple Peanut Sauce

**Peanut Butter Breakfast Bread Pudding with Maple Peanut Sauce**

Prep time: 20 minutes  
Cook time: 35-40 minutes  
Servings: 4

- Butter
- 2/3 cup creamy peanut butter, divided
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1 1/2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 4 cups cubed brioche or challah bread, cut into 3/4-inch cubes
- 2/3 cup pure maple syrup

- 1/3 cup crushed peanuts
- powdered sugar, for garnish

Heat oven to 350 F. Butter four 4-ounce ramekins.

In bowl, mix 1/3 cup peanut butter, eggs, sugar, milk, vanilla and salt. Toss bread cubes in mixture until thoroughly coated. Divide evenly among prepared dishes. Bake until custard is set in middle and tops are golden, about 35-40 minutes. If tops of bread brown too quickly, cover ramekins loosely with aluminum foil.

In small saucepan over low heat, combine remaining peanut butter and maple syrup until thoroughly warmed.

To serve, drizzle ramekins with maple-peanut sauce and garnish with chopped peanuts and powdered sugar.

Substitution: Whole wheat rolls may be used in place of brioche or challah bread.

**Peanut Butter Squares**

Prep time: 20 minutes  
Cook time: 20 minutes  
Yield: 24 squares

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 1 package (17 1/2 ounces) peanut butter cookie mix
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 tablespoon water
- 1 egg
- 3 cups miniature marshmallows
- 2/3 cup light corn syrup
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 1 bag (10 ounces) peanut butter chips

- 2 cups crispy rice cereal
- 2 cups salted roasted peanuts

Heat oven to 350 F. Spray 13-by-9-inch pan with nonstick cooking spray.

In large bowl, stir cookie mix, oil, water and egg until soft dough forms. Press dough into prepared pan.

Bake 15-20 minutes, or until set.

Sprinkle marshmallows over crust. Bake 1-2 minutes until marshmallows begin to puff. Remove from oven.

In 4-quart saucepan over low heat, heat corn syrup, butter, vanilla and peanut butter chips, stirring constantly until chips are melted and smooth. Remove from heat.

Stir in cereal and peanuts; spoon mixture evenly over marshmallow layer.

Refrigerate 30 minutes, or until firm. Cut into bars and serve.

# NIH strategic research plan addresses growing tickborne diseases threat

The incidence of reported cases of tickborne diseases in the United States has significantly increased in recent years. It is expected to continue to grow as tick species expand their geographical reach and new tick-transmitted pathogens emerge, raising the potential for serious human illness and death.

A new strategic research plan from the National Institutes of Health aims to build on — and accelerate — new and existing research initiatives to improve scientific understanding of ticks and the pathogens they may transmit and to develop the necessary tools and strategies to better diagnose, prevent and treat tickborne diseases.

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and

Prevention, 59,349 cases of tickborne disease were reported in 2017 compared to 48,610 cases in 2016. Lyme disease accounted for the bulk (82%) of the cases. Recent CDC estimates suggest that Lyme disease is underreported and that the true incidence is likely 10 times higher. At least 20 different disease-causing bacteria, viruses and parasites are known to be transmitted from ticks to people. Depending on the disease, patients can experience symptoms that range from mild infections that resolve on their own to serious illness, extended disability, or death.

Many tickborne diseases have been discovered only recently. For example, in 2009, scientists reported a red-meat allergy, known as alpha gal

syndrome. Growing evidence suggests that this reaction may be associated with the bite of a tick, but further research is needed to understand this connection.

Newly identified tick-transmitted pathogens continue to be reported, raising concerns about missed diagnoses, inadequate treatment, and knowledge gaps related to tickborne diseases.

The new NIH Strategic Plan for Tickborne Disease Research focuses on five scientific priorities for advancing research and development over the next five years.

First, the plan calls for improving fundamental knowledge of tickborne diseases, including the biology of tickborne pathogens; how they are transmitted to humans,

evade the immune system, and spread within the body. This area also includes determining the cause of persistent symptoms in some people infected with tickborne diseases, such as Lyme disease, and furthering the understanding of how tick-derived factors contribute to the establishment and severity of disease.

Second, the plan calls for improving detection and diagnosis of tickborne diseases by developing rapid diagnostic tests that can detect a pathogen both early and late in infection and distinguish between active and past infections.

Third, NIH will support the development of diagnostics capable of predicting treatment success and identifying human biomarkers of infec-

tion and persistent symptoms. The new plan also prioritizes the acceleration of research designed to prevent tickborne disease infection, including vaccines, and immune-based treatments, as well as strategies to reduce the transmission of tickborne pathogens to animal populations that serve as hosts.

Fourth, the plan focuses on research to develop new treatments for tickborne diseases and techniques to reduce disease complications. Fifth, the plan prioritizes the development of tools and resources to advance tickborne disease research by improving scientists' access to biological samples, tickborne disease genetic data, and supporting preclinical development of promising products.

NIH intends to expand collaborations across its institutes and centers to promote a multidisciplinary approach to tickborne disease research, answer complex biological questions and encourage the application of state-of-the-art technologies used successfully in a range of scientific disciplines.

The new NIH strategic plan builds on the activities of the Department of Health and Human Services Tick-Borne Diseases Working Group, which issued a 2018 report to Congress outlining research recommendations. NIH sought input from the research and medical communities, patient advocacy groups, pharmaceutical industry, and the general public in developing this strategic plan.
