Making health and nutrition a priority during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic

There is little doubt that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is affecting every aspect of our lives—from virtual classrooms to telecommuting to early restaurant closing times to outright quarantines. Observing public health measures and reducing exposure to the virus are required to slow the spread of this disease. No one knows how long these virus safety measures will need to stay in place, but it presents a perfect time to protect and improve your health while practicing social distancing. Healthy eating is especially important for keeping your immune system in top condition. Here are some steps you can take to eat healthy in the times of COVID.

Minimize trips to the supermarket during the pan-

demid and eat healthy. Before you shop for Coronavirus preparations...

Plan ahead. Visualize breakfast, lunch, and dinner for at least five days. What will you serve? What do you need? Consider the foods your family likes, your food preparation methods, interests and skills, and the time and energy you will have for preparing meals. Working from home may not mean there is more time to cook—especially if you are now responsible for teaching your kids and doing the work your employer expects.

Have children at home? Include children in meal planning, preparation, and clean up while teaching them writing, math, reading, and science.

Reading/Writing: Ask your kids to make a list of what's in the pantry and refrigerator. Then, have them look through cookbooks or online recipes sites to find

meals and snacks that use up what is on hand. Have them share their breakfast, lunch, or dinner meal ideas.

Math: Find math in measuring spoons and cups, counting out numbers of ingredients, taking stock of pantry items, or planning the time it will take to prepare, cook, eat, and clean up a meal.

Science: Get kids involved in baking bread, cooking an egg, or creating a homemade salad dressing—then, search the internet to discover the science behind why ingredients change when they are combined, heated, or blended

Think nutrition. The healthiest meals emphasize whole grains, vegetables, and fruits—serve them in the greatest amounts. Meat portions should be smaller—this will save money and help keep dietary saturated fat in check.

Make a shopping list—and use it! You'll be less like to forget items or buy impulse items.

Stock up on nutrition-

packed foods that will stay fresh for a week or longer.

Breads - corn tortillas, whole grain English muffins, bagels, breads, wraps, frozen whole wheat waffles

Grains - instant oatmeal, quick cooking pasta, frozen brown rice, couscous, refrigerated pizza crust

Fruits - sturdy fresh fruit (apples, citrus), dried, plain frozen, canned in juice or water

Vegetables - sturdy fresh veggies (celery, broccoli, onions, potatoes), plain frozen, low sodium canned, sundried

Sauces - tomato pasta sauce, salsa

Soups & Broths - canned, frozen, shelf-stable cartons

100% Juice - refrigerated, frozen, canned, boxed

Milk - fresh, canned, shelf-stable packages

Eggs - fresh eggs, egg whites in cartons

Cheese - sliced, cubed, shredded, crumbled, grated hard cheese

Beans/Legumes - canned beans (black beans, chickpeas), dry beans

Nuts and seeds - bagged, canned, nut butters

Chicken - frozen or canned

Seafood - frozen ready-to-cook fish fillets, frozen shrimp, canned tuna, salmon, and sardines

Beef - pre-made frozen lean ground patties or meatballs

Flavorings - add zing with dried herbs & spices, vinegars, mustard, hot/steak sauces, lemon/lime juice, light dressings, honey, Greek yogurt

Go easy on the frozen dinners—most are high in sodi-

um, fat, and calories.

Limit purchases of tempting foods like chips, sodas, cookies, and ice cream. They are high in empty calories and run up your grocery bill.

Keep costs down—consider low cost alternatives. Instead of buying ready-made hummus, pureed a drained can of chickpeas to make your own. Try a meatless meal, like chili with beans instead of beef. If fresh fruits and veggies are too costly—remember, canned and frozen fruits and vegetables provide the same nutrients as fresh. Best bets are plain frozen veggies and fruits. Go for low sodium canned veggies and fruits canned in juice or water—if these are in short supply, buy regular canned fruits and veggies—drain and rinse before use.

Think about friends and neighbors, especially older adults or those with health conditions. Could you save them a trip to the grocery store?

While at the supermarket during the Coronavirus pandemic...

- Use a disinfecting wipe—wipe your hands and grocery cart handle, then put the wipe in the trash.

- Prepared for the unexpected—supermarkets are running low on many items. Be ready with a back-up plan if an ingredient you need is unavailable.

- Keep the less fortunate in mind—contribute to local pantries and soup kitchens now. Then, when it is all over—donate extra food you stocked up on that is still fresh and safe to eat.

- Use contactless payment or credit cards. If you use the payment keypad, tap the buttons and screen with your knuckle—then use hand sanitizer after completing your payment.

Eat out safely during the Coronavirus pandemic with restaurant curfews

-If you want to have take-out meals, take the food home right away and eat it while it is hot. Store leftovers safely—wrap tightly and refrigerate any dishes with meat, fish, poultry, or dairy products—be sure to reheat these leftovers thoroughly before eating.

- Make eating together at home a positive experience

Whether it is homemade or takeout, eating more meals at home is a new routine for many families. Keep the stress down by making mealtime fun.

- Get the family involved—kids can help set the table, pour the water, make the salad, or grate the cheese. Make mealtimes a family affair.

Try some new recipes—if you have never made homemade pizza, roasted a whole chicken, or cooked meatballs from scratch—now is a good time to try! There are lots of great recipes on the internet! Look for those that call for only a few ingredients and use common kitchen tools.

Reconnect with the family—eat together at the table or spread a blanket on the floor and have an indoor picnic. Wonder what to talk about at mealtime? Chat about things you will do this summer, tell jokes—just keep the conversation upbeat and fun.

HISTORICAL NOTEBOOK

SMALLPOX EPIDEMIC CLAIMED LIFE OF ALBION COLLEGE STUDENT

Wash your hands. With the advent of the COVID-19 outbreak across our country, we are reminded that there have been several contagious disease outbreaks in our Albion history. The Spanish influenza outbreaks in 1918 and 1919 were especially cruel, taking the lives of many Albion citizens. The smallpox epidemic of March, 1921 here (at least 14 cases) and other smallpox outbreaks earlier also produced fears amongst our population.

In Riverside Cemetery there is an unusual tombstone in Block 24, Lot 10 containing over three dozen names of Albion people. No, this isn't a mass grave, but rather the tombstone of one departed Albion girl, Mary Louise Weaver (1852-1871). Mary was the only daughter of Norman and Mercy Weaver, who lived at 15 W. Ash St., later renumbered as 205 W. Ash St. For reference, this became the Robert Pollman home in the mid-20th century that was demolished a couple of years ago. Norman's occupation is listed

as a driver, which would be driving a team of horses pulling a wagon.

Mary was quite an accomplished musician. A student at Albion College, she sang in the choir and at social gatherings. She played the organ at her church, and was well liked by all who knew her. She was afflicted with the dreaded smallpox virus disease and died on June 7, 1871 at the young age of 18. Because of the nature of the disease and the fear of contracting it, she was buried at night with no funeral procession or rites.

A recollection written five years later revealed the sad fate of the Weaver family: "Financial reverses and misfortune came upon the young lady's father, stripping him of home and all earthly promises, leaving her parents bereaved, desolate, advanced in years, almost distracted. The lifeless form of their only daughter, but 18 years of age, beautiful, accomplished, was borne to the silent tomb in the darkness, with no solemn process, no funeral rites."

In memory of Mary, a large group gathered at her gravesite a few days later after her burial, after they were sure the virus was gone, and held a memorial service. Her classmates and local citizens pitched in and raised \$200 to erect a heavy marble tombstone in her memory. The top inscription reads, "We Miss You, Mary Louise, Dau. of Norman & Mercy Weaver. Died June 7, 1871, Aged 18 Years & 7 months." In the center portion is inscribed in styled lettering the following poem: "To her whom we esteemed; Whose memory we revere; But in whose illness none could go; And speak one word of cheer; He by this monument would show; Her memory lives with us below."

Underneath, in two columns, are inscribed the names of her classmates: C. F. King, Rena Stone, C. H. Silliman, Eva Woodruff, Carrie B. Irwin, M. C. Cosae, Frank Silliman, Marion Moore, Rose S. Adams, Minnie Silliman, Hattie Olcott, H.C. Phippany, Esther Moore, Dora M. Grigor, G. W. Bortles, Addie Woodruff, Belle Stone, C. H. Gale, Nellie Garrison, Ida C. Furbish, E. Guilbault, G. L. McGregor, L. A. Tichenor, Belle Gardner, and H. P. Rockwell.

The reverse side of the stone carries this message: "Notwithstanding we were deprived the privilege of visiting you during your affliction,

yet we esteemed you as a dear friend, and appreciated your many virtues, and in token thereof, have erected this monument." The names of these Albion citizens are inscribed below with the prefix "Mrs. & Mrs.": B. B. Bissell, D. H. Patterson, A. W. Silsbee, J.M. Jameson, J. H. Monroe, E. D. Comstock, Dr. C. W. Stone, I. W. Reed, E. J. Arthur, L. F. Ashley."

From our Historical notebook this week we present a photograph of Mary Louise Weaver,



and her tombstone. How many of our readers have ever viewed this tomb-

stone in Riverside Cemetery? Wash your hands again.

How Executive Order 2020-21 will be Enforced by MSP - Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How will the "Stay Home" Executive Order be enforced?

The order directs Michiganders to stay in their homes unless they've been designated as a critical infrastructure employee by their employer, engaged in an outdoor activity while maintaining social distancing, or performing tasks necessary to the health and safety of themselves or their family, like going to the hospital or grocery store. Executive Order 2020-21 is not a recommendation, it is an order necessary for the health and safety of all Michiganders.

Executive Order 2020-21 was effective on March 24, 2020 at 12:01 am and continues through April 13, 2020 at 11:59 pm. Under this order, individuals may only leave their home or place of residence under very limited circumstances, and they must adhere to social distancing measures recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention when they do so, including remaining at least six feet from another person when outside the individual's residence to the extent feasible under the circumstances.

The goal of this order is simple: stay home, stay safe, and save lives.

Will the MSP be stopping people for being out on the streets and issuing tickets or approaching businesses that appear to still be open?

Executive Order 2020-21 authorizes critical infrastructure workers and persons engaged in an outdoor activity or performing tasks necessary to the health and safety of themselves or their family,

to leave their homes for these limited purposes. For this reason, there are no plans to randomly stop people or to conduct a coordinate campaign to inspect businesses to ensure compliance with this order. With that said, Executive Orders do carry the weight of law and the MSP stands ready to enforce any aspect of these orders, if needed. However, given the serious nature of COVID-19, we are confident that Michiganders will take notice and voluntarily comply, as it is in the best interest of the entire state that we all work together to stay home as much as possible.

Is the National Guard enforcing this order?

No. The National Guard is being used for humanitarian missions across the country. In Michigan, the Michigan National Guard is assisting with ensuring the medical supply chain.

Are the freeways closing? Will there be checkpoints?

No. Critical infrastructure workers need to be able to fulfill their duties, and Michiganders need to be able to perform tasks necessary to the health of themselves or their family, such as going to the hospital, pharmacy or grocery store. Law enforcement is hopeful Michiganders will recognize the seriousness of this situation and voluntarily comply with this order.

Will you be stopping everyone you see?

No. Law enforcement will be visible and prepared to take action if violations are warranted, but we are optimistic that individuals and businesses will recognize the serious nature of this order

and will comply by staying home.

What happens to those caught violating the order?

Executive orders carry the weight of law and violators can face up to a 90-day misdemeanor or up to a \$500 fine. Businesses in regulated industries can also face licensing and other restrictions.

Who's considered essential and allowed to travel to work?

Executive Order 2020-21 prohibits in-person work that is not necessary to sustain or protect life. Specifically, it says "No person or entity shall operate a business or conduct operations that require workers to leave their homes or places of residence except to the extent that those workers are necessary to sustain or protect life or to conduct minimum basic operations." For purposes of this order, workers who are necessary to sustain or protect life are defined as "critical infrastructure workers." The EO details that these workers may include:

- Health care and public health
- Law enforcement, public safety, and first responders
- Food and agriculture
- Energy
- Water and wastewater
- Transportation and logistics
- Public works
- Communications and information technology, including news media
- Other community-based government operations and essential functions
- Critical manufacturing



- Hazardous materials
- Financial services
- Chemical supply chains and safety
- Defense industrial base
- Child-Care workers

Anyone with questions should consult the guidance and direction in Executive Order 2020-21.

Is the media essential?
The Executive Order does identify the news media as part of Communications and Information Technology, which means that a journalist could be considered a critical infrastructure worker for purposes of this order.

When do you call 911 versus the COVID-19 hotline?

911 should be reserved for requesting emergency services only. Persons with questions about COVID-19 should review the resources available at www.michigan.gov/Coronavirus. Residents can also call the MDDHS COVID-19 hotline, seven days a week, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., at 888-535-6136.

Per CDC guidance, persons who believe they are exhibiting symptoms or have been exposed to COVID-19, should contact their

medical provider first to have their symptoms screened. At this time, not everyone's symptoms or medical history qualifies them for testing. Do not show up to a medical facility without first contacting a medical provider.

What about the homeland security letter that is floating around authorizing federal employees to travel for work?

Per the Executive Order, federal law enforcement employees are considered critical infrastructure workers.

Where can I find more

information and clarification about this order?

The Executive Office is working as quickly as possible to clarify specific areas of the order, based on questions they are receiving from industry and the public. A list of FAQs that can be found here is being continually updated.

Gov. Whitmer calls on Michiganders to donate medical supplies, personal protective equipment to hospitals

LANSING, Mich. — With many hospitals throughout Michigan facing potential shortages of face masks and other essential medical supplies and personal protective equipment, Governor Gretchen Whitmer called upon Michiganders and businesses to donate items needed most by hospitals and medical providers.

"Our brave medical professionals and first-responders are on the front lines of keeping us safe, and we must do everything we can to protect them and every Michigander we can from the spread of COVID-19," Governor Whitmer said. "Right now, medi-

cal professionals across the state are forced to reuse face masks. This increases the risk of spreading COVID-19 during a time when we should do everything we can to mitigate it. We're not getting the tools we need from the federal government, so it's on all of us to work together to protect each other."

"Our clinicians are working tirelessly to care for those affected by this pandemic," said Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Chief Deputy for Health and Chief Medical Executive Dr. Joneigh Khaldun. "They deserve to be able to do their jobs safely and these donations will

help protect the health and safety of both providers and patients."

Several Michigan businesses have stepped up in the last two weeks to manufacture personal protective equipment for Michiganders. Today, Ford, 3M, the UAW, and GE Health Care announced a partnership to manufacture respirators to help Michiganders fight the spread of COVID-19. Distilleries like Coppercraft Distillery in Holland and Mammoth Distilling in Traverse City have announced plans to manufacture and distribute hand sanitizer to health care providers in their areas. Donations of essential items

will be used to meet medical providers' most pressing needs during the COVID-19 pandemic. Below are the material donations most needed by hospitals. This list will be updated as efforts continue to progress.

- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for 20 seconds. If not available,

use hand sanitizer.

- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or upper sleeve when coughing or sneezing.

- Avoid contact with people who are sick.

- If you are sick, stay home, and avoid contact with others.

- Stay at least 6 feet away from others when in a public setting.

Senior Spotlight

Older adults and coronavirus

Older adults, 65 years and older, are at higher risk for severe illness. COVID-19 is a new disease and we are learning more about it every day.

What you can do if you have a serious underlying medical condition:

- Stay home if possible.
- Wash your hands often.
- Avoid close contact (6 feet, which is about two arm lengths) with people

who are sick.

- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- Avoid all cruise travel and non-essential air travel.

- Call your healthcare professional if you have concerns about COVID-19 and your underlying condition or if you are sick.

Stress and coping

Older people are at a higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 which may result in increased stress during a crisis.

Fear and anxiety about the COVID-19 pandemic can be overwhelming and cause strong emotions.

Things you can do to support yourself

- Take breaks from watching, reading, or listening to news stories and social media. Hearing about the pandemic repeatedly can be upsetting.

- Take care of your body. Take deep breaths, stretch, or meditate. Try to eat healthy, well-balanced meals, exercise regularly, get plenty of sleep, and

avoid alcohol and drugs.

- Make time to unwind. Try to do some other activities you enjoy.

- Connect with others. Talk with people you trust about your concerns and how you are feeling.

- Call your healthcare provider if stress gets in the way of your daily activities for several days in a row.

- If you, or someone

you care about, are feeling overwhelmed with emotions like sadness, depression, or anxiety, or feel like you want to harm yourself or others call 911.

Beware of COVID-19 related fraud

Scams related to the coronavirus, also known as COVID-19, are rapidly increasing as the public health emergency develops. Scammers are targeting older adults and those with serious long-term health conditions who appear to have a higher risk for serious illness from COVID-19.

Fraudsters are attempting to bill Medicare for sham tests or treatments related to the coronavirus and are targeting individuals to illegally obtain money or Medicare numbers.

What can you do to stop COVID-19 fraud?

- Do not give out your Medicare number to anyone other than your doctor, health care provider, or other trusted representative.

- Protect your Medicare number and treat your Medicare card like a credit card.

- Never provide your Medicare number to anyone who contacts you through unsolicited calls, texts, or emails.

- Be cautious of anyone who comes to your door offering free coronavirus testing, treatment, or supplies.

- Don't click on links from sources you don't know,

which could put your computer or device at risk. Make sure the anti-malware and anti-virus software on your computer are up to date.

- Be cautious when purchasing medical supplies from unverified sources, including online advertisements and email/phone solicitations.

- Ignore online offers for vaccinations. If you see ads touting prevention products or cures for COVID-19, they are most likely a scam.

- Do your homework before making a donation to a charity or crowdfunding site due to a public health

emergency. Be particularly wary of any charities requesting donations by cash, by gift card, or wire transfer.

- Be alert to "investment opportunities." The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) is warning people about online promotions, including on social media, claiming that the products or services of publicly traded companies can prevent, detect, or cure COVID-19 and that the stock of these companies will dramatically increase in value as a result.

What does Medicare cover in relation to COVID-19?

- Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance) covers COVID-19 tests when ordered by your doctor or health care provider on or after February 4, 2020.

- Medicare covers all medically necessary hospitalizations, including extra days in the hospital for patients who had to stay longer under COVID-19 quarantine.

- There is no vaccine for COVID-19 at this time; however, if one becomes available, Medicare will cover it.

- Medicare also recently expanded coverage of telehealth services to enable

beneficiaries to access a wider range of services from their providers without having to travel to a facility.

This includes access to doctors, nurse practitioners, clinical psychologists, and licensed clinical social workers.

- During this emergency, there are also more options for the ways your providers can talk with you under this provision.
