DIFS is reminding Michiganders of housing assistance programs

(LANSING, MICH) The Michigan Department of Insurance and Financial Services (DIFS) is reminding consumers of options that may be available to support homeowners who are having difficulty making payments.

"If you are experiencing financial hardship and you are concerned about your housing, there are resources available to help you," said DIFS Director Anita Fox. "Many mortgage companies have programs to help people avoid foreclosure, so reach out right away if you are worried about falling behind on your payments. Your lender or servicer will look at your

situation and help you consider the options that may be available to you."

Foreclosure restrictions placed on mortgage servicers by the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) have expired, but there may be other options for consumers. It is important to:

Pay if you can: If you can pay your mortgage as agreed, you should continue to do so.

Don't wait: If you are having trouble paying your mortgage, contact the company you make your payments to right away. You should find its contact information on the statements you receive on your mortgage loan.

It may not be too late: Even if you have missed one or more mortgage payments, and have not contacted your mortgage company, it may not be too late. Contact the company you make your payments to today to ask for assistance.




A SUNDAY SCHOOL PICNIC

August is the time for annual family-clan reunions with all the activities and the hot summer sun that goes with it. Similarly, for many years numerous Albion churches held "Sunday School picnics" for its members, particularly for the children. They would be loaded up in cars and go to a favorite park such as at Dudek's along the Kalamazoo River towards Concord, or to Swains Lake Park and others.

Some church members had farms where these outings were held. One such person was Delos D. Snyder (1844-1933) of a pioneer Albion family, whose farmhouse was at 73553 28 Mile Road (M-99) in South Albion between Homer and Albion. Delos was a member of our local Methodist Episcopal Church on E. Erie St., Albi-

on's largest congregation at the time.

From our Historical Notebook this week we present two photos, taken by photographer Frank Bennett sometime during the 1910s. The first shows several automobiles filled with children. They are lined up on E. Erie St. ready to make the excursion to South Albion to the Snyder farm. The caption translates, "Methodist Episcopal Sunday School Juniors Picnic 'On the Way.'" The second photo shows the large group of children in front of the Snyder farmhouse, along with their adult chaperons. Notice the hats the boys/men wore back then are different than the "baseball" caps that are worn today. The fact that there are American flags placed on the cars, and also patriotic bunting hang-



ing from the Snyder porch in these photos, makes me think that this picnic could have been held on the 4th of July.

Nowadays, excursions are made to places like Cedar Point, or to a Detroit Tiger baseball game for the youth of a church. Back then

however, an old-fashioned Sunday School picnic was just the thing to keep the youth entertained by featuring horseshoes, home-made

ice cream, softball games, and other fun as well as lots of food. How many of our readers have ever been on a Sunday School Picnic?

Attorneys general form bipartisan task force against robocalling

LANSING - Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel announced that the State of Michigan is joining a nationwide Anti-Robocall Litigation Task Force of 50 attorneys general to investigate and take legal action against the telecommunications companies responsible for bringing a majority of foreign robocalls into the United States. This bipartisan nationwide task force has one goal: to cut down on illegal robocalls.

"Robocalls aren't just a Michigan problem. They are a nationwide problem. That is why I am proud to join my fellow attorneys general. We will take this fight to anyone who helps these scammers and

robocallers. If the telecom industry won't police itself, the task force will," said Nessel.

The task force has issued 20 civil investigative demands to 20 gateway providers and other entities that are allegedly responsible for a majority of foreign robocall traffic. Gateway providers that bring foreign traffic into the U.S. telephone network have a responsibility to ensure the traffic is legal, but these providers are not taking sufficient action to stop robocall traffic. In many cases, they appear to be intentionally turning a blind eye in return for steady revenue. The task force will focus on the bad actors throughout the telecommunications

industry, to help reduce the number robocalls and benefit the companies that are following the rules.

Attorney General Nessel is committed to stopping illegal and unwanted calls. According to the National Consumer Law Center and Electronic Privacy Information Center, over 33 million scam robocalls are made to Americans every day. These scam calls include Social Security Administration fraud against seniors, Amazon scams against consumers, and many other scams targeting all consumers, including some of our most vulnerable citizens. An estimated \$29.8 billion dollars was stolen through scam calls in 2021. Most of this

scam robocall traffic originates overseas. The task force is focused on shutting down the providers that profit from this illegal scam traffic and refuse to take steps to otherwise mitigate these scam calls.

Attorney General Nessel offers the following tips to avoid scams and unwanted calls:

- Be wary of callers who specifically ask you to pay by gift card, wire transfer, or cryptocurrency. For example, the Internal Revenue Service does not accept iTunes gift cards.
 - Look out for prerecorded calls from imposters posing as government agencies. Typically, the Social Security Administration does not make phone calls to individuals.
 - If you suspect fraudulent activity, immediately hang-up and do not provide any personal information.

Senate passes PACT Act

The Senate voted Tuesday night to pass a long-sought bipartisan legislation to expand health care benefits for millions of veterans exposed to toxic burn pits during their military service, sending the bill to President Joe Biden to sign into law. The final vote was 86-11.

Passage of the bill marks the end of a lengthy fight to get the legislation through Congress, as veterans and their advocates had been demonstrating on Capitol Hill for days. Many veterans were allowed into the Senate gallery to watch the final vote on Tuesday evening, CNN reported.

The bill would potentially provide new support for about 3.5 million veterans, about one in every five living in America today, according to Military Times. There are eligibility categories for Vietnam, Gulf War and post-9/11 veterans who faced exposure to toxic fumes.

Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer made the announcement after reaching the deal with Republicans who had blocked the bill from advancing last week while they sought to add cost-controlling amendment votes to the package. The bill, called the Honoring our PACT Act, was ap-

proved by the House of Representatives in July.

VA Secretary Denis McDonough released the following statement:

"Veterans who were exposed to toxic fumes while fighting for our country are American heroes, and they deserve world-class care and benefits for their selfless service. The bipartisan PACT Act will help VA deliver for those veterans — and their survivors — by empowering us to presumptively provide care and benefits to vets suffering from more than 20 toxic exposure-related conditions."

"To those veterans, their families, caregivers, and survivors: you can apply for PACT Act benefits by filing a claim at VA, and you can learn more about the PACT Act at VA.gov/PACT or by calling us at 1-800-MyVA411. We'll be communicating with you every step of the way to make sure that you and your loved ones get the benefits you've earned."

"Once the president signs this bill into law," he concluded, "we at VA will implement it quickly and effectively, delivering the care these veterans need and the benefits they deserve."

Keep medicines, vitamins and supplements out of children's reach

(StatePoint) While you may already understand the importance of keeping medicines safely up and away from the reach of little ones, you may not be treating your vitamins and other supplements with as much care. Experts warn that these products also pose safety risks and should be kept up and away and out of sight and reach of young children.

"We've seen this play out recently with melatonin supplements. Recent data show that between 2012-2021, the annual number of pediatric ingestions of melatonin increased more than 500%, with approximately 220,000 ingestions by young children reported to U.S. poison centers. Pediatric hospitalizations and more serious outcomes also increased, largely

due to an increase in unintentional melatonin ingestions," says Mary Leonard, managing director, Consumer Healthcare Product Association (CHPA) Educational Foundation. "Much like medication, you take vitamins and supplements to feel your best, but they can be dangerous if left out and within reach of children in the home."

To keep kids safe, the CHPA Educational Foundation in collaboration with the Up and Away campaign of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention-led PROTECT Initiative, is reminding families that safe medicine storage also includes vitamins and other supplements. To prevent accidental ingestions, keep all medicines, vitamins and other supplements -- including those

in gummy form -- up and away and out of sight and reach of young children. The following tips can help:

- Keep medicines, vitamins and other supplements (including those carried in purses, bags, pockets or pill organizers) in a safe location that is too high for young children to reach or see.
- Never leave medicines or vitamins out on a counter, table or at a sick child's bedside.
- At home or away, keep medicines in child-resistant containers until right before you take them.
- Always relock the safety cap on bottles. If it has a locking cap that turns, twist it until you can't twist anymore or until you hear the "click."
- Teach children what medi-

cine and vitamins are and why you or another caregiver must be the one to give it to them.

- Never tell children that medicine or vitamins are candy so they'll take it, even if your child doesn't like to take their medicine.
- Remind babysitters, houseguests and visitors that purses, bags or jackets that have medicines or vitamins in them should be kept up and away and out of sight when they're in your home.
- Keep the Poison Help number in all of your phones: (800) 222-1222 or text "POISON" TO 797979 to automatically save it.

EARTH TALK

Questions & Answers About Our Environment

Dear EarthTalk: How are reptiles faring these days in the face of climate change and other environmental threats?

-- L.M. Smith, Boston, MA
Reptiles, like other animals and plants, face growing threats as human influence on the environment increases. Certain reptiles are especially threatened; some 61 percent of turtles are threatened or extinct. Tracking the exact consequences of human activity on reptiles, however, has been difficult as research has primarily focused on mammals and birds, which draw more public attention, although evaluations have found reptiles to be more threatened than birds.

A recent study that observed 10,196 species determined that 21.1 percent of

reptiles are at risk of extinction. These species contain an estimated 15.6 billion years of phylogenetic diversity (PD). This science uses a phylogenetic tree, which shows how closely related species are, to describe the amount of biodiversity in an ecosystem and obtain a more useful measurement than just counting numbers of species. In addition, the adaptations of reptiles to ecological conditions perform help sustain ecosystems, including supporting food chains. Threats to reptiles include habitat loss and environmental damage, invasive species, diseases, pollution, exploitation, poaching and global climate change.

Habitat destruction is the largest threat. As urban sprawl, overgrazing and desertification—which in turn prompt expansion of logging and agricultural operations—put greater pressures on land, reptile habitats have been overtaken by humans, creating increasingly stressful conditions for reptiles. Shrinking habitats increase edge effects—which are the effects of separating habitats (like with a road) such that animals cannot reach resources or mates

in other parts of the habitat. Now climate change is exacerbating these pressures. Since many reptiles are ectothermic—they cannot generate internal heat and instead rely on external conditions (e.g. sunlight) to warm themselves—temperature increases due to climate change affect them significantly. Many arid-climate reptiles (e.g. lizards and geckos) are already experiencing extremely high temperatures, and minor increases could make their already limited habitats unlivable.

Furthermore, reptiles are particularly prevalent in regions of Southeast Asia, where disruptions to monsoon cycles can obstruct development of reptiles in embryo. Many species—turtles, crocodiles and alligators, for example—lay eggs in wet conditions. Newly-dry and disrupted regions threaten their abilities to survive, cause slow development or growth and skew the natural selection of sex ratios.

Some good news is that methods implemented to protect other types of animals—reducing tropical deforestation, controlling illegal trade and improving productivity

in agriculture such that agricultural lands do not need to be expanded—benefit reptiles similarly. However, the current crisis behooves more action to improve conditions for reptiles in particular.

Readers should encourage their representatives to take action. Reptiles play a crucial role in the Earth's ecosystems, and concerted solutions have the potential to make all the difference.


